A LEGACY TO HONOR

For nearly a century, the Japanese Institute of Sawtelle has stood as an enduring symbol of the history of Japanese Americans in Los Angeles, and the deep roots they continue to share in the westside community of Sawtelle.



Established in 1925 by first-generation Japanese immigrants, JIS was built as a school to teach Japanese language and culture to their American-born offspring, and thereby preserve and promote their language and rich cultural heritage. The lot on which JIS is currently located was originally purchased in 1928 and saw the construction of the school's four classrooms. The auditorium was subsequently added in 1940.

JIS was closed with the advent of World War II, and the forced relocation of the Japanese population. The facility was actually used as the staging area where community residents were loaded onto the buses that took them to Manzanar.

In the Post-War aftermath, Sawtelle saw revitalization with the return of the Japanese American community. JIS once again took up its mantle in Japanese language instruction, and as a social hub and resource center for the growing community's multigenerational families.



Today, JIS remains the heart of the community, both for its historical significance as one of the earliest Japanese American cultural institutions in the United States, and for its potency as a community symbol—home to a vigorous Japanese language school; a gathering spot for family, martial arts, and senior activities; and a cornerstone for the broader community.



A FUTURE TO BUILD


While JIS proudly wears its history well, the same cannot be said of its facilities. Built in 1928 and last renovated in 1958, the JIS buildings are showing their age, and are sorely in need of major rehabilitation and upgrading.
